

Clean Green PAKISTAN

The Government of Pakistan launched the Clean and Green Pakistan Movement (CGPM) in October 2018. The CGP has a specific focus on empowering the citizens to seek access to basic services but also making themselves equally accountable and responsible for Clean Green Pakistan. In November 2019, the Prime Minister of Pakistan launched two key initiatives i.e., Clean Green Pakistan Index (CGPI) for cities ranking and Clean Green Pakistan Champion Program (CGCP). The Ministry of Climate Change developed both programs with the support of UNICEF, AWF (Pvt.) Ltd, HA Technologies, and other sector partners.

1. Clean Green Pakistan Index (CGPI)

The Clean Green Pakistan Index (CGPI) is a city/tehsil and neighborhood-level index which aims to rank cities/tehsils and neighborhoods according to their cleanliness and greenery.

CGPI is used for cities' ranking against each component's performance indicators, including safe drinking water, solid waste management, hygiene, plantation, and total sanitation with an equal weight of each (20%). Each pillar has multiple sub-indicators both at the household and neighborhood level. The purpose of CGPI is to rank the cities based on greenery and cleanliness. The pilot phase is being implemented in 13 cities of Punjab and 7 cities of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. In the next phase, more cities will be added to the competition. To report progress, all relevant provincial and district departments are assigned a Web/IP address to access the Clean Green Pakistan Index (CGPI) and to input the data online against the set performance indicators for the relevant component/s.
